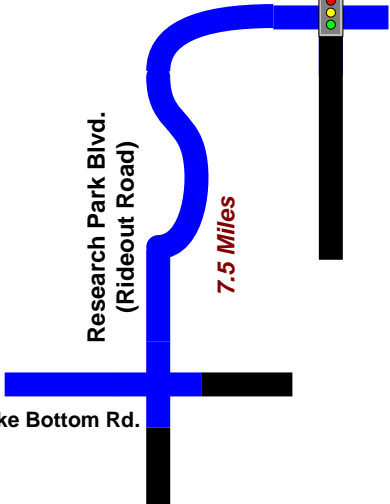

Directions From Intersection of Blake Bottom Rd. and Research Park Blvd.

- North on Research Park Blvd. to Memorial Parkway – turn Left (North again)
- Take 431 Across AL/TN border to 275 and turn Right (West)
- Follow 275 – at about 4 miles you will come to a strange jog in the road. The map above makes it look longer than it actually is. It is only a few hundred feet from the stop sign. You will take the right and follow the road sharply left around the cemetery. Stay on 275.
- The next left that I take is about 1.2 miles from the jog onto Oliver Smith Road. There is no stop sign. You can continue on and follow the signs for 275 and end up at the same place.
- Follow the road (275) through a tiny town called Flintville to the right turn onto Pendergrass Road. There is a larger cemetery at the intersection. If you miss it, no problem, just say on 275. It comes to Hwy 64 as well.
- Follow Pendergrass for a couple of miles until you reach the stop sign on 64.
- If you look to the right while at the stop sign you will probably see the rock entryway for Fish Hatchery Road. Turn right then make your first left (North) onto Fish Hatchery Road which will head sharply downhill.
- Stay on Fish Hatchery Road for about 3 miles. At 2.5 miles start looking to your left for a brown sign that says Lincoln Lake. Turn left onto Lincoln Lake Road.
- The road will split a short distance from the turn – stay to your right. You will pass a small park on your left just before the road turns hard left over the dam.
- You will then ask yourself if it makes sense to venture onto the dam - don't worry – its okay – drive across the dam.
- Continue up the road which will turn left again, go past a few more cottages, then the road splits – stay to your left and road turns to gravel. This is our driveway. Head up the hill into the woods and we are at the end. You made it...
